Selection of Itinerary Highlights:

SS. Thistlegorm – Shaab Ali

Probably the most famous of the Red Sea wrecks. The 129m English Freighter was bombed by German aviation on 6th October 1941. Today she creates an artificial reef on a sandy bottom at 32m max depth. She is home to an enormous variety of marine life and is especially popular with large schooling fish.

The El Mina (Minesweeper)

At approximately 70m in length and with a beam of 9.5m, the minesweeper lies in the harbour in Hurghada on it's port side in 33m of water at the stern and 26m at the bow. There are a lot of small holes to peer into and penetration is possible, although tight, through much of the wreck. Sea urchins are abundant and a very large moray resides inside.

Ghiannis D

The Ghiannis D sank with its cargo of timber in 1983 and lies next to a coral reef. The entire wreck can be seen from either end because of good the visibility. It is broken up in the Center, but the bow and stern remain intact. Expect to see glassfish, scorpion fish, angelfish, bumphead wrasse and a napoleon fish. The dive can be finished by traversing the reef, or by climbing up the mast, which rises up to only four metres below the surface.

Birchwood 11 (Suez Wrecks)

BRAND NEW WRECK DISCOVERED BY BLUE O TWO on board Blue Fin on 3rd April 2006 along with Brighton BSAC.

Sank in the 1940's with a cargo of Welsh coal. Penetration is possible as the gaps are large, but is not necessary as the interesting parts of the wreck are visible from the outside. The prop and rudder are worth checking out because they are immense. The sea life is fantastic, with thousands of glassfish on and around the deck and the possibility of spotting tuna and other large fish, perhaps even a reef shark.

The Carnatic

A beautiful 19th Century wreck that lies on Sha'ab Abu Nuhas Reef. Its shallow depth means that it is accessible to all levels of diver and all levels will appreciate it as a great wreck dive. The majority of your dive can be done along the outside of the wreck however if you wish penetration into the holds is easy for any level of diver. To finish the dive you can head back along Sha'ab Abu Nuhas reef where you will be able to find many different types of coral and fish before ascending.
